GOOD CLEAN FUN

For custom color and a quicker crochet session, double up the yarn like we did for this bath mitt (we used turquoise and white). P.S. Scrub-ology™ yarn gets softer when wet, making it ideal for rough 'n' tough and sensitive skin types alike.

Scrub-ology™ yarn is key to making these fun projects. Grab a skein (or two!) of the tough-yet-gentle material, and let's begin.

GLOSSARY

beg - begin(ning)
CC - contrasting color
ch - chain
dc - double crochet
hdc - half double crochet
MC - main color
rep - repeat
rnd - round
sc - single crochet
sk - skip
sl st - slip stitch
st(s) - stitch(es)

WHAT YOU WILL NEED

Yarn Bee® Scrub-ology™
90 yds, one skein each of
Turquoise (450) and White (100)

Size J, 6 mm crochet hook

DIRECTIONS

Holding one strand of turquoise and one strand of white together:

Ch 30, sl st to first ch to form ring.

Rnd 1: Ch 2, *dc in next ch, rep from * around, sl st in second ch to join.

Rnd 2-10: Rep row 1.

Rnd 11: Ch 2, dc in next st, * sk 1, dc in next 2 sts, rep from * around.

Rnd 12-14: Rep row 11.

Cut yarn and fasten off. Using a darning needle, sew opening closed with yarn tail.

Ch a 1-foot length. Weave in between sts at wrist, and tie ends in a bow.

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WHAT YOU WILL NEED

Yarn Bee® Scrub-ology™

90 yards, one skein each of

Yellow (700), Pink (650),

Turquoise (450) and Green (300)

Size 1, 5.5 mm crochet hook

DIRECTIONS

Two-color dishcloth—start with MC, change to CC at rnd 5.

Three-color dishcloth—start with MC, change to first CC at rnd 3, change to second CC at rnd 6.

Rnd 1: Working into a magic loop—ch 2 (counts as first st here and throughout pattern), 10 hdc, sl st to beg ch to join. (11 sts)

Rnd 2: Ch 2, hdc in same st, 2 hdc in each st around, sl st to beg ch to join. (22 sts)

Rnd 3: Ch 2, hdc in same st, *hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st, rep from * around, sl st into beg ch to join. (32 sts)

Rnd 4: Ch 2, hdc in same st, *hdc in next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st, rep from * around, sl st into beg ch to join. (42 sts)

Rnd 5: Ch 2, hdc in same st, *hdc in next 3 st, 2 hdc in next st, rep from * around,

Rnd 5 cont'd: sl st into beg ch to join. (52 sts)

Rnd 6: Ch 2, hdc in same st, *hdc in next 4 sts, 2 hdc in next st, rep from * around, sl st into beg ch to join. (62 st)

Rnd 7: Ch 2, hdc in same st, *hdc in next 5 sts, 2 hdc in next st, rep from * around, sl st into beg ch to join. (72 st)

Rnd 8: Ch 2, hdc in same st, *hdc in next 6 sts, 2 hdc in next st, rep from * around, sl st into beg ch to join. (82 st)

RAGTIME RINGER

Jazz up your dishwashing experience with a DIY'd scrubbing rag. Use multiple Scrub-ology™ yarns for unique color combos to match your kitchen (or a friend's). Psst... This project is great for beginners.





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WHAT YOU WILL NEED

Yarn Bee® Scrub-ology™
 90 yards, one skein each of Yellow (700), Pink (650) and Green (300)
Size I, 5.5 mm crochet hook

DIRECTIONS

With yellow (pink) yarn, ch 36 (54).

Row 1: Dc in third st from hook, *sk 2 sts, 1 dc in next st, ch 2, 1 dc in same st, rep from * to end of row.

Row 2: Ch 2, turn, 1 dc in ch 2 space, ch 2, 2 dc in same space, *(2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in next ch 2 space, rep from * to end of row.

Row 3: Ch 2, turn, 5 dc in next ch 2 space, *6 dc in next space, rep from * to end of row.

Fasten off. Roll strip of work up to form a rose shape. Use darning needle and tail of yarn to sew in place.

Handle

Using green yarn, ch 10 (14).

Row 1: Hdc in second ch from hook, 1 hdc in each st across row.

COMING UP ROSES

Gently exfoliate from face to feet with these scrubby, crocheted blossoms—constructing them is easier than it seems. (Hint: Roll and stitch.) Check out our pattern for specifics, including how to add the leafy handle.

Row 2: Ch 2, turn, 1 hdc in each st across row.

Leaf

Make 1 (2)

Using green yarn, ch 7.

Sc in second ch from hook, sc in next ch, hdc in next 2 chs, dc in next ch, 4 dc in last ch, 1 dc in next st, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in next 2 sts, sl st to first st.

Use darning needle and yarn tail to sew handle and leaves in place.
